


2021 Year in Review

ADVOCACY



The Affordable Housing Credit Improvement Act of 2021 was reintroduced and garnered 31 SENATE and 132 HOUSE cosponsors.

The bill estimated to:



Incentivize building over 500,000 affordable homes over the next decade



Generate \$48.5 billion in wages and business income



Generate \$19.1 billion in additional tax revenue



Create 510,000 jobs



Supported regulatory changes through comment letters on:

- Down Payment Assistance
- Opportunity Zones



Successfully advocated for the reinstatement of the Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing (AFFH) Rule, which is designed to overcome patterns of segregation and foster inclusive communities.



Rebuilt and reinstated HUD & FFB Risk Sharing partnership, working closely with HUD to advocate for program's reinstatement.
